











INTRODUCTION

Further to communication from the Environmental Management Authority (EMA) on the Draft Terms of Reference (TOR) for the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) in respect of an application for a Certificate of Environmental Clearance (CEC) for the establishment of a 500-Room Resort on 18.7258 Hectares of land at Tyson Hall between Kilgwyn Bay Road and Store Bay Local Road, Tobago; letters of invitations were issued on the 26th and 29th August 2022; to relevant agencies, non- governmental organisations and other members of the public to the First Focus Group Consultation on the Draft TOR on 07th September 2022. We hereby provide an account of these deliberations.

INVITATIONS

Fourteen (14) Letters of Invitation were issued to relevant agencies, non- governmental organisations and other members of the public. The invitations were accompanied by a copy of the draft TOR. Table 1 details the list of invitees and the attendees of the Consultation.

Appendix 1 set out a template of the Letter of Invitation issued, while *Appendix 2* shows the signed Attendance Register confirming attendees.

GENERAL APPROACH

The Consultation had three main presentations. The first was given by Mr. Ellister Lewis – Founder/CEO, DSM Investments Ltd; the second by Mr. Daniel Lambert - CEO, FCL FINANCIAL LTD, Convenor/Consultant of the Project; and the third by Dr. Ramsook and his OptimalGESL Team, all focused on the merits and relevance of the draft TOR. The Agenda for the proceedings is set out in *Appendix 3*.

DSM Investments Presentation - Summary

The major points from Mr. Lewis' presentation are identified below.

Why pursue the Project?

Tobago has the resources; beautiful beaches and people. We should make an investment into an all-inclusive resort that would bring tourists to Tobago and bring in foreign exchange.

 DSM further educated the audience on the merits of the project and would like to garner the opinions of the key stakeholders in considering the proposed EIA draft TOR.

15. FCL FINANCIAL LTD Presentation - Summary

Mr. Lambert chaired the meeting, and his contribution was focused on the Project, the background of the Project Team, the benefits of the Project to Tobago's Economy and the importance and elements of the Draft TOR to the EIA process.

He presented and discussed via power point, each of the elements of the TOR. The full presentation is set out in *Appendix 4*.

The key points are set out below:

- The proposal includes the application for a 500-room all-inclusive luxury resort. This
 development falls under the Apple Leisure group and under the direct management of
 AMResort, a leading brand management company in the All-Inclusive Luxury Resort
 market. He advised that in November 2021, Apple Leisure Group merged with the Hyatt
 Corporation thus becoming the largest player in the All-Inclusive Luxury Leisure market.
- There will be two brands associated with this development. Dreams® is a family-oriented hotel which will accommodate 300 rooms, whereas Secrets® will be 200 rooms resort for adults only.
- The resort will also have 12 villas, restaurants and bars, a spa, a water park, multipurpose courts, tennis courts, convention center. The building footprint is 40% of the land.

- The resorts will provide 16% of the visitors and 20% of rooms that the Tobago Tourism Medium-Term Plan 2019-2023; set out as necessary to develop the market
- The project is located between Tyson Hall and Kilgwyn Bay and bordering ANR Robinson Airport.
- He advised that there will be a capital injection of US\$100 million for construction, the
 estimated operating annual income will be \$69.4 million US. The employment during the
 construction phase of two years is 1800 people. Upon completion, there will be 818
 permanent jobs. It is anticipated that 35,000 visitors will visit the resort on an annual basis
 from Year 5 of operation.

FEEDBACK

Mr. Lambert paused and invited questions/comments.

- There were a number of issues raised by Mr. Curtis Douglas from the All Tobago Fisherfolk Association, which are set out below.
 - o My concern is how you are going to impact the fishing and the environment.
 - o How is this going to impact the wetlands and nurseries for fish?
 - o How is the sewage going to affect the fish?
 - When you have these all-inclusive resorts, the business does not trickle down as merchandise and food would be imported.
- Mr. Lambert indicated that the EMA has been in step with Mr. Douglas' thought process and directed the meeting to the understated sections of the Draft TOR.
- Definition of the requirements of the TOR; the direct and indirect impacts (environmental and socio-cultural) on the project.
 - Analysis of alternatives, we will be looking at geology, environment, etc are in the TOR.
 We need to be monitoring.
 - We need consultation for the long-term success of the project. Yes, we are seeing problems with other developments in Tobago. This consultation process is very important. We are on the right path if we have several iterations and maximize opportunities. He indicated that the consideration of these matters will go a long way to address Mr. Douglas' concerns.

Based on the foregoing, the Focus Group was invited to discuss the Draft TOR from a power point presentation set out in *Appendix 4*.

OptimalGESL Presentation – Summary

Dr Ramsook and his OptimalGESL Team of Dr Trina Halfhide (Environmental Scientist) and Ms. Erin Mangal (*Environmental Biologist*)- OptimalGESL discussed the EIA process and details that were utilized during the consultative drafting phases of the TOR between OptimalGESL, the DSM and the EMA. The full presentation is set out in *Appendix 5* and the key points are set out below;

- Dr. Ramsook indicated that OptimalGESL has a good operational history and presence in Tobago having worked with the community and Fisherfolk in the Friendship and Tyson Hall districts on other projects.
- Preliminary perimeter survey work was executed last year 2021 over the area being considered for the hotel development; and that such works assisted the EMA to develop a robust draft TOR. Mr. Curtis Douglas from All Tobago Fisher Folk Association was pleased to hear this and commended DSM for taking a knowledge-based approach to scoping the draft TOR.
- The DSM has put together a plan to make the environment work with the project; build with nature Indonesian and Central American Hotel coast zone management
- Ms Erin Mangal described the EIA process and the timeline and time sensitive processes. The public will have 30 days to respond when the EMA post the comments of the EIA.
- Dr Halfhide highlighted the different areas/ zones in the proposed area. There are all
 three species of mangrove (red, white and black). There is a fringing reef. There is a turtle
 nesting site. There is need for proper management to ensure the natural resources that
 are there are maintained.
- Noise and air quality monitoring station have been defined and will form an important component of the works to be executed as per TOR- wet and dry season
- The plan is to make this resort into an eco-tourism resort, where mangroves are to be maintained and create natural walkways through the mangrove area with all paved areas, caulking and drainage plans as per draft TOR be integrated into to the conceptual designs.

FEEDBACK

- Mr. Dave Elliot, the IMA representative iterated that a perimeter survey/informed definition of the environment is a step in the right direction, to be a check point and provides assurance that the TOR is robust and ensures that once adhered too there is indeed compliance.
- Mr. Elliot who is also a scuba diver and from the area, raised these further concerns:
 - o The west end of the property, there was a sluice gate. Isn't there?
 - There is longshore drift, and any dredging will be affecting the reef. The coral you are seeing dying is the staghorn coral. They are naturally fragile.
 - What will be removed? Mangroves are protected by the Ramsar Convention.
 Kilgwyn Wetland is the second largest in Tobago. What will the state be of these with the development?
- Dr Ramsook addressed Mr. Elliot's concerns and mentioned that the plans are not to remove the wetlands but to do development around it; Build with Nature (BwN). The plan is to make this resort into an eco-tourism resort. He advised that the TOR addresses eight (8) items in the EIA and surpasses the requirements of the EIA.

CONCLUSION

The meeting commenced at 9:45 am and concluded at 12 noon. Based on the attendance and the participation of the Focus Group overall satisfaction was met as per the content of the draft TOR; verified by the receipt of seven (7) signed Feedback Forms, see *Appendix 6*. It is our opinion that the Draft TOR was well received and accepted; and therefore, does not need to be modified.

INTRODUCTION

Further to communication from the Environmental Management Authority (EMA) on the Final Terms of Reference (TOR) for the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) in respect of an application for a Certificate of Environmental Clearance (CEC) for the establishment of a 500-Room Resort on 18.7258 Hectares of land at Tyson Hall between Kilgwyn Bay Road and Store Bay Local Road, Tobago; letters of invitations were issued on the 16th, 22nd, 24th and 29th November 2022; to relevant agencies, non-governmental organizations and other members of the public to the Second Focus Group and Public Consultation on 05th December, 2022. Agenda was the presentation of the results from the Wet and Dry season sampling and public feedback.

We hereby provide an account of these deliberations.

INVITATIONS

Thirty-one (31) Letters of Invitation were issued to relevant agencies, non-governmental organizations and other members of the public. The invitations were accompanied by a copy of the Final TOR. Appendix 1 shows the signed Attendance Register confirming attendees while Appendix 2 details the Letters of Invitation issued as well as the management of the invitation process and e-mail correspondences.

OVERVIEW

A development is being planned for the construction and operation of a 500 room Five Star Hotel on lands in the Kilgwyn Bay area in Caanan, Tobago. As a part of the process to obtain the necessary planning approvals and to obtain the participation and buy-in of the community in the catchment area, the developers have undertaken to hold two public consultations in the that area. The first public consultation involved the key stakeholders in the sector with the second being targeted at the wider community.

This report describes the outcome of the second public consultation held to inform and seek opinions from the residents of the community in the Kilgwyn Bay catchment area. The consultation was held on the afternoon of December 5th, 2022, at the Rovanel's Resort. The consultation lasted for over two and a half hours and elicited significant responses from the many participants present.

OBJECTIVES

- To present the findings of the baseline scientific and socio-economic and sociocultural investigation conducted
- To inform the community of the development plans for the area and solicit feedback, concerns, and suggestions
- To develop a relationship with the wider catchment community as the planning progresses

PARTICIPANTS

The consultation's participants were drawn from several groups and individuals including:

- Residents of the area
- The Caanan/Bon Accord Village Council
- Farmers and others using the area as a means of income generation
- Fishermen operating from the bay and within the ecosystem
- Divers with experience in the area
- Environmental groups and individual environmentalists
- Representatives of archaeological groups
- Governmental agencies including the Tobago House of Assembly Divisions, Fire Service and Police Service and other interest groups.

See the full list of participants attached - Appendix 1. In addition to these participants at the consultation, contact was made with a number of interested individuals and entities in the area who could not make it to the actual consultation. These contacts involved both the use of an online survey and one on one discussions.

PRESENTATIONS

The team conducting the consultation include the project developer, DSM Investments and Optimal Geoscience and Engineering Solutions, the company undertaking the scientific and socio-cultural and socio-economic analysis for the project. The consultation was moderated by Mr. Daniel Lambert (FCL Financial Limited), and individual presenters listed below made presentations on:

- The rationale for the project and the potential benefits to the community and the wider Tobago community
- The current scientific and environmental status of the project site
- The Architectural design of the project
- The Socio-economic and socio-cultural environment

DSM/FCL INVESTMENTS PRESENTATION

Summary The major points from Mr. Lewis' and Mr. Lamberts' presentation are identified below.

DCM ARCHITECTS PRESENTATION

DCM Architects were represented by Mr. Alvar Cordata. Mr. Cordata proceeded to give a virtual presentation of the hotel project description. The presentation was very illustrative augmented by hotel master plan drawings and design details. Engineering and design details were given on the main hotel buildings and footprint, back of the house logistics facilities; portable water sources, power supply and waste storage and disposal, subsurface and surface drainage, and landscaping applications. Mr. Cordata demonstrated that the hotel design and footprint will only infringe on the onshore environment (40 % of the proposed site); preserving the mangrove and beach, the main eco-tourism attractions of the area. There will be no physical infringement of the marine

environment. The hotel design adopts the built with environment philosophy; trying to preserve as much the natural landscape and environment.

OPTIMALGESL PRESENTATION – SUMMARY

Dr Ramsook and his OptimalGESL Team of Dr Trina Halfhide (Environmental Scientist) and Ms. Erin Mangal (Environmental Biologist)- OptimalGESL discussed the methodology and relevance of the dry and wet season sampling undertaken at the proposed hotel project site and details that were utilized during the consultative drafting phases of the TOR between OptimalGESL, the DSM and the EMA. The full presentation is set out in Appendix 4 and the key points are set out below;

- Dr. Ramsook indicated that OptimalGESL preliminary perimeter survey work executed last year 2021 over the area being considered for the hotel development helped defined the sample points for both wet and dry season sampling
- Dr. Ramsook proceeded to define the Physical Site Environment Description providing a mix of desktop and primary studies data. Of key importance was the current surface drainage and hydrology characteristics of the study area.
- Dr Halfhide highlighted the sampling methodology/regime and sampling international standards adhered too for both wet and dry season. She proceeded to demonstrate the results and subsequent analysis of both onshore and nearshore water and sediment quality testing. Key focus was on those testing parameters that exceeded EPA and EMA limits and currently has a negative impact on the mangrove and nearshore environment.
- Ms Erin Mangal highlighted the sampling and survey methodology/regime and international standards adhered too for both wet and dry season. She proceeded to demonstrate the results and subsequent analysis of both ecological surveys in wet and dry seasons. Focus was given to species demographics, transect ambiguities, season trends and migratory patterns. Turtle nesting patterns from desktop studies was demonstrated and nearshore reef environment character qualitatively and quantitatively characterized.
- Ms Erin Mangal also highlighted Noise and air quality testing results and analysis- wet and dry season. Methodology and frequency of sampling described as per TOR and results integrated into the environmental impacts given.
- Ms. Jan Thompson provided a summary of the Scio-economic impacts of the proposed hotel project within a 5km radius of project area. Brief descriptive on area demographics and land use were presented with current resource assessments for the area. Quantitative data from questionnaires/surveys were shared (survey base of 139)

respondents). Key concerns and positive impacts shared. Mitigations and grievance mechanisms presented.

• Dr. Ramsook closed by presenting briefly some of the Impacts and Mitigations via an impact assessment matrix linked with the pre-construction, construction and operational phases of the hotel project.

After OptimalGESL team presented, the floor was left open to attendees to ask questions, raise concerns etc.

FEEDBACK

ISSUES/CONCERNS RAISED AND RESPONSES

Upon the completion of the presentation, the audience was given the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues they had involving the project. Approximately 18 persons of the 70 or so present took the opportunity to do so and the main issues raised along with the developer's response is presented in the table below.

Issue/Concern	Developers Response
Agricultural Linkages	The project reiterated its commitment to sourcing local products of the desired quality and to working with local producers in the construction phase to ensure that they could meet these requirements when the hotel is operational.
Role of the THA	The developer referred to previous meetings and presentations with the THA Executive Council and their commitment to working with the THA in integrating the project with the community.
Choice of the All-Inclusive Model	The developer referred to a previously developed medium term strategy for Tobago based on the provision of a number of five-star all-inclusive properties to transform the level of visitor arrivals coming to Tobago. reference was also made to the success of that strategy through established and proven Brands.
Closeness of project to airline take-off	The project group has been in discussion with the Airport Authority and they were also invited to the consultation.
Knowledge of Villagers re: the project and overall commitment to keeping developer guarantees	The developer reiterated their commitment to the community and being inclusive at each stage of the process.
Desired guarantee of Commitment to the Community	Developer referred to the requirements of financial institutions in the current environment that makes developers adhere to the commitments they make communities.

Impact on Archaeological Sites	A commitment was given to include these considerations during the construction process.
Impact on turtle nesting sites	The scientists were aware of the turtle nesting sites and an undertaking was given to establishing monitoring stations to continue to assess the situation given that there is a level of poaching taking place. Additionally, the project does not intend to have any construction on the berm where existing turtle laying takes place, and also promises to have very low-level lighting in the area.
Impact on bird species and the guarantee that commitments made to the community will be kept.	The developer reiterated the reasons outlined previously.
Concerns that the project was being undertaken in an industrial fire risk zone given the presence of Cove Estate and the Airport	The developer assured the audience that they will work closely with the fire services and other authorities in ensuring that adequate precautions are taken in the design of fire prevention systems.
Amount of natural vegetation to be removed during development	Optimal Geoscience and Engineering Solutions reassured the audience regarding the approach to construction that involved minimal removal of vegetation.
Concern about employment numbers	The developer noted that the employment numbers were based on the fact that the hotel will have to employ greater numbers of staff in the beginning and reduce numbers as the hotel becomes more efficient.
Respect for cultural importance and sustainable development	Developer reiterated their desire for a social contract with the community

Design schedule for the project	The developer elaborated on the deadlines for the EIA process, the availability of the proposals for public scrutiny and the factors that affects their 2023 construction start up.
Developer's Corporate S Responsibility Policy	Developer referred to the relationship with the operator, Secrets, the Apple and Hyatt Group and their demonstrated commitment as a high value brand.

Mr. Lambert sought the attendees vote by show of hands to participate in the optional site visit as per original second consultation advertisement and the attendees unanimously opted not to part-take.

DSM thanked all the contributors and attendees for the very active and engaging second consultation.

Beach and Coastal Processes



- Kilgwyn Coastline, is predominantly medium to coarse grained sands, with decreasing fractions of fine sand, very coarse sand, very fine sand, and little to no mud respectively.
- Beach sands are moderately-sorted, platykurtic to very platykurtic bioclastic sediments
- Waves approach from the southeast Mean significant wave height is 0.13 m (+/-0.08 m) with a period of 5.23 (+/-3.04 s) while the breaker height is 0.15 m (+/-0.11 m)
- Mean longshore flows in a predominantly westerly direction. Current averages 11.91 cm/s (range 1.93-43.52 cm/s, +/-11.12 cm/s)





Kilgwyn Ecosystem Services

- Used by many different organisms at different stages of their lives.
- Detritus from leaves and other organic matter break down in the wetland and is used as food by aquatic insects, gastropods, crustaceans and even some small fish. This energy on to higher trophic levels of the food web.
- Breeding and migrating birds, mammals, fish and other animals depend on the existing wetland for a safe habitat and nutrients/feeding
- Wetlands help reduce the speed of water as it flows over the landscape.
- Kilgwyn wetland provides immense water storage benefits while slowing water to reduce potential floods and erosion rates.
- The wetland pollutants from airport operations and urban runoff counteracting their harmful impacts on the watershed and marine environment
- Littoral and Beach strand vegetation supports the beach berm preventing beach and coastal erosion loss due to storm surges and hurricanes

Kilgwyn Bay, Flying Reef and Backreef

Kilgwyn Bay as being located on the Windward Coast of South-western Tobago

Flying Reef

- 1.5 km long with a total mean live cover of about 48 %.
- Intermittent and interspersed by patches of coral rubble, Palythoa beds, Thalassia patches, and sand.
- 17 species of hard coral have been recorded.
- Main reef fish species recorded on the reef were from the familiesPomacentridae, Labridae, Scaridae, Haemulidae, Acanthuridae and Serranidae.
- A 2014 survey identified the presence of 20 species of fish the assemblage of which was found to be that of intermediate relief lowcoral cover.

Backreef Zone

Consisted of mainly coral rubble (approximately 66.5% of the substrate) & sand (approximately 15.9%), with the remainder of the benthos consisting of coral stone (4.5%), dead coral boulders (7.8%) and dead coral formations (5.4%).

The Backreef was much less diverse than the forereef because of its shallow nature and lack of 3D structures

- Live corals observed Lesser Starlet Coral (S. radians) and Clubtip Finger Coral (P. porites)
- Fish species Several Parrotfish (Scaridae) species, Sargent Major (Abudefdufsaxatilis) and Wrasse (Halichoeres sp.) No fish were observed in the immediate nearshore area.
- Turtle Grass (T. testudinum) interspersed in the nearshore area.
 When encountered plants were sparse/thin, did not occupy an areas in excess of 4 ft².
- The two major types of macroalgae were a Red Algae species (Acanthophorasp.), and Watercress Algae (Halimeda opuntia).
